

Dollars for Scholars Awards \$504,000 to Class of 2013

DOLLARS FOR SCHOLARS awarded 96 college scholarships to 66 local students at its 48th Annual Awards Ceremony, held at Sebastian River High School's Performing Arts Center on May 23, 2013. This year's recipients will receive \$504,000 in need-based financial aid to attend 28 colleges and universities in 9 states and the District of Columbia.

Parents, friends, alumni and donors gathered as scholarship sponsors and board members presented the awards. Alumni Speaker Kathy Lawson, a 2002 graduate of Duke University and 1998 Richardson Scholar who graduated from Sebastian River, urged this year's recipients to take advantage of every opportunity and, whenever possible, to "give back." In that spirit, Kathy and her husband started a scholarship fund this year to "pay back" \$50 given to her by a teacher so she could apply to Duke. Kathy grew up in a single parent household and credits generous Indian River County residents with making her education possible.

This year's scholarship packages range from \$2,000 to \$20,000 for the most prestigious Richardson and Jaffe awards. These highly competitive awards went to:

Richardson Scholar Awards: Vero Beach High School seniors Nicolette Brownstein, who will attend Georgetown University majoring in political science and Molly Higgins, who will attend Carnegie Mellon University majoring in international business

Frances and Ronald Jaffe Education Foundation

Scholarships: Caroline Colbert, Sebastian River High School, who will attend MIT majoring in nuclear engineering, and Harshonnati Jain, Vero Beach High School, who will attend the University of Miami on a pre-med track.




